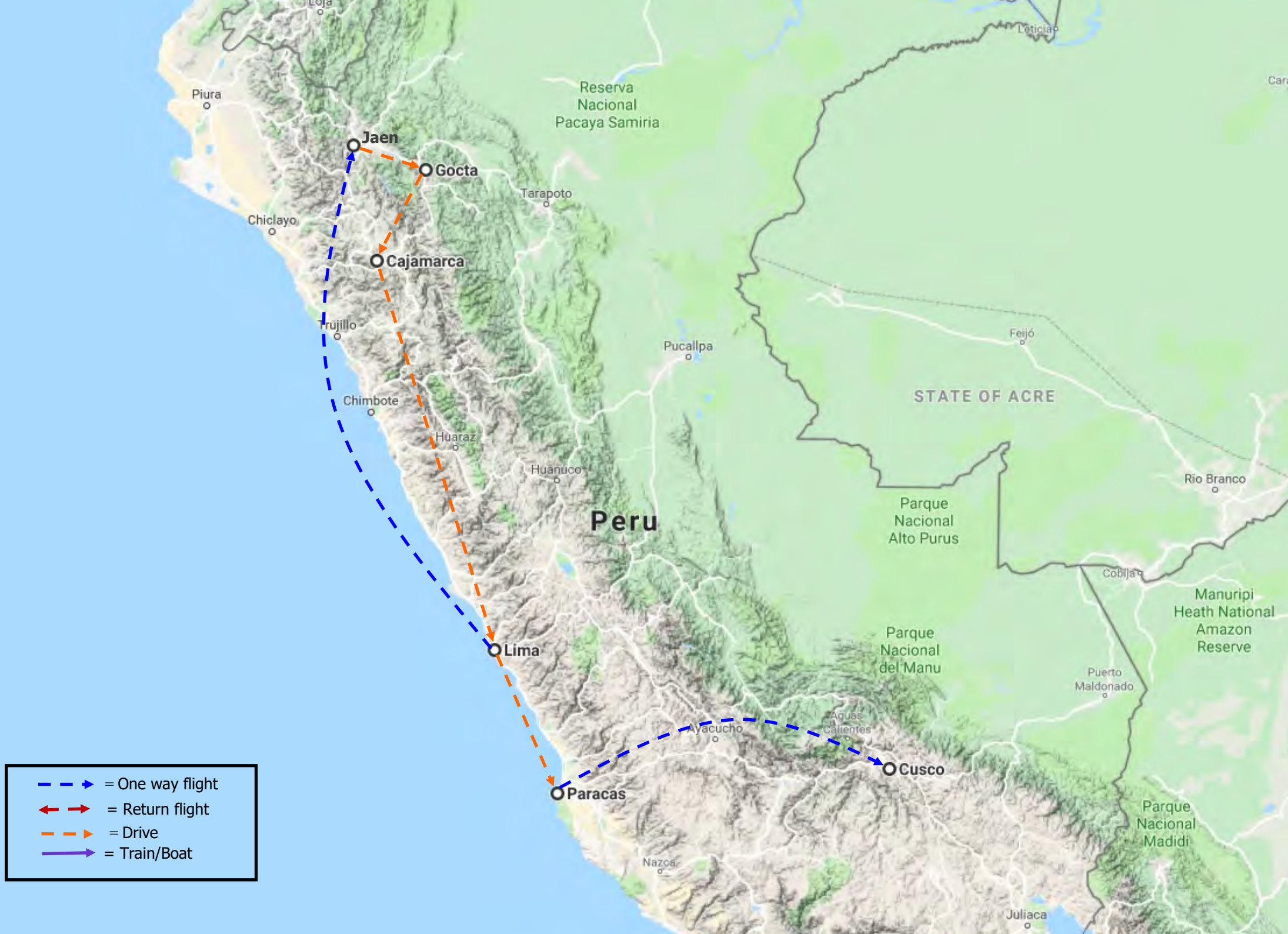
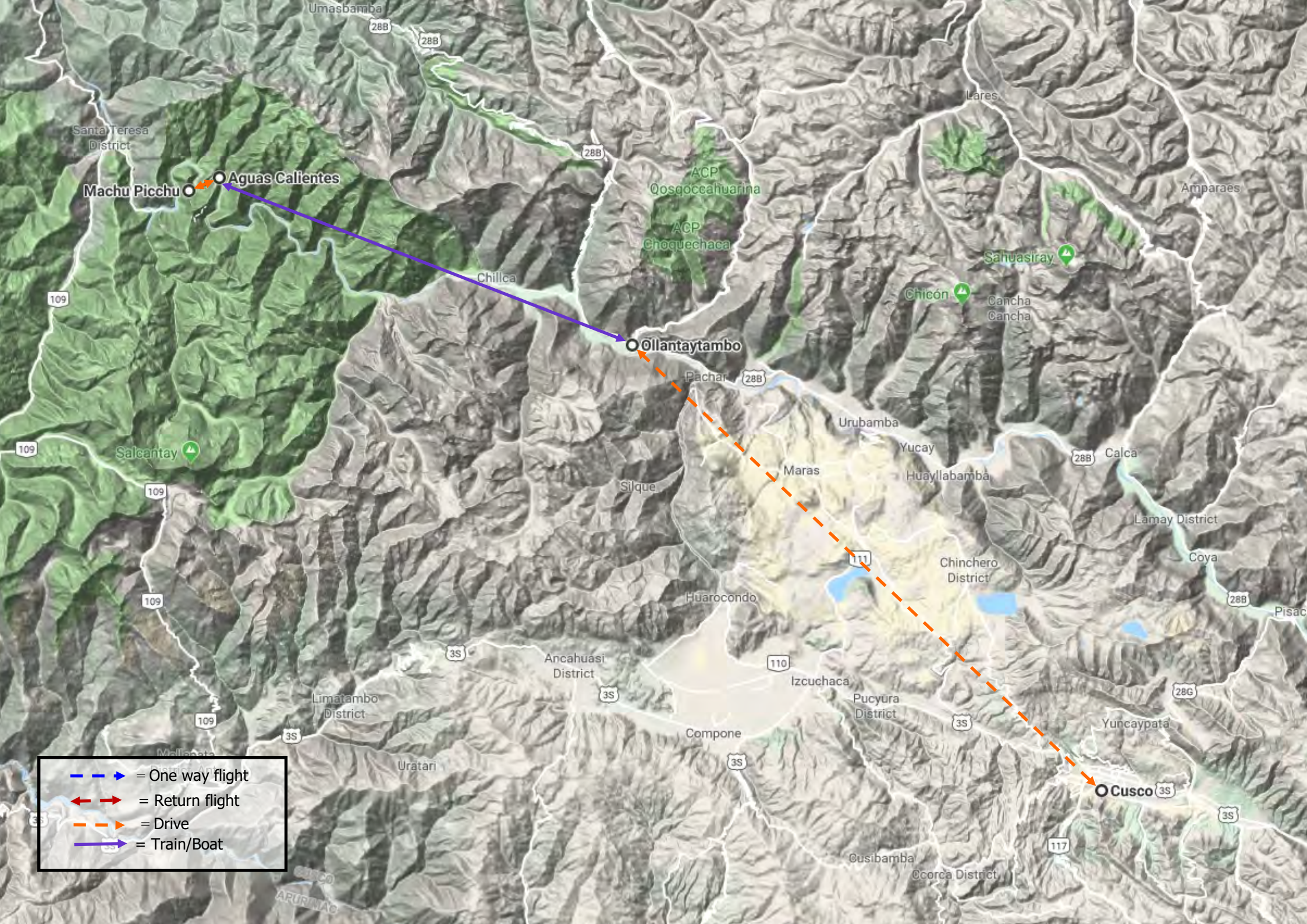

Your Final Itinerary...

Day 1, Fly to Lima

Depart the UK on a flight to Lima, via Miami.

Welcome on arrival and private transfer to your hotel.

Lima, the capital and at the same time the largest city of Peru, is located on the country's desert coast, sandwiched between the central Andean highlands and the Pacific Ocean. It was founded by the Spanish Conquistador Francisco Pizarro in 1535 and served as the capital of Spain's South American possessions. Discover this historical "City of Kings" (La Ciudad de los Reyes), its vibrant metropolitan areas and world-famous Peruvian cuisine.

Meals: In-flight meals

Day 2 Historic Lima, Casa Aliaga & Larco Museum

This morning your private guide will meet you at the hotel and accompany you to see the historic centre of Lima. For nearly 5 centuries, Lima was the capital of the Spanish colony in South America and by visiting places such as the main plaza, Osambela house and Santo Domingo Monastery, you'll gain a true impression of this impressive past. Visit Casa Aliaga, a fantastic colonial house built in 1535 by one of the Spanish Conquerors arriving with Francisco Pizarro himself. This house has been inhabited by his descendants for over 16 generations until today.

If time allows, and if of interest, head to the Larco Herrera Museum. The museum is privately owned and contains a magnificent and rich collection of pre-Columbian art. It is housed in an 18th-century vice-royal building built over a 7th-century pre-Columbian pyramid. It showcases chronological galleries that provide a thorough overview of 4,000 years of Peruvian pre-Columbian history.

The remainder of today is at your leisure.

Day 3, Culinary Tour & Urban Biking

Peru was recently awarded as the World's leading culinary destination and Lima is with no doubt the food capital of Peru. Amazing biodiversity, a huge variety of local ingredients, pre-Columbian and Spanish culinary traditions mixed with influences from all over the world and the creativity of local chefs are some of the elements that have, and are still, building a fantastic local cuisine.

A local host-chef will meet you for a gastronomy tour during which you can learn about Peruvian food, culture and art.

Shop at one of Lima's markets and then continue to Barranco district for a short walk through the charming streets, art galleries and shops. You will be lead to your host's private apartment, where you participate in a hands-on cooking class while enjoying a Pisco Sour. The experience ends with a typical Peruvian lunch.

This afternoon set off on an easy bike around the two main cultural areas of Lima: Miraflores and Barranco. Today's ride will combine the themes of art, history and architecture. Ride past beautiful homes that once were occupied by renowned writers, painters and musicians. Pass by cultural centres, parks, shops, art galleries, ateliers, cozy local cafes and classic bars. Special attention will be paid to street art work, graffiti, street food and to the cultural manifestations of two of the most important areas of the city. Your guides will stop to share anecdotes, stories and classic urban legends of the local folklore of this vibrant part of the city.

Day 4, Fly Lima to Jaen and drive to Gocta

Transfer early this morning to the airport in Lima for a flight to Jaen.

You will be welcomed on arrival in Jaen and transferred to Cocachimba for a 2 night stay. The drive time is 3-4 hours.

Afternoon at leisure.

Accommodation: Gocta Natura

Meals: Breakfast & Dinner



Day 5, Gocta Waterfall visit - (30 minute drive to San Antonio village)

Enjoy a lower altitude day hike – around 1,800-2,000 metres above sea level).

From this point, start the hike to the upper section of Gocta waterfalls, one of the highest falls in the world at 770 metres. This walk will take you through a cloud forest featuring a wide variety of fauna and flora, including monkeys, toucans, orchids and giant ferns, among others. Compared to the option of hiking from the hotel to the base of the waterfall, this one goes through higher terrain which will allow you to enjoy fantastic panoramic views. The way back follows the same path that took you towards the waterfall.

Day 6, To Leymebamba, cable-car and visit Kuelap - (about 3 hours drive total)

Today you will visit the ancient Kuelap Fortress. Leave the hotel with a private vehicle and transfer 1.5 hours to Tingo Town and a further 20 minutes to where Kuelap is located to take the cable car to Kuelap fortress, the largest pre-Hispanic archaeological site in Chachapoyas, featuring a 600m long and 20m high wall.

Built around 1,000 AD, Kuelap covers an extension of almost 6 hectares, and is located at an altitude of 3000 metres above sea level, on a plateau dominating the Utcubamba valley. The archaeological complex features about 350 structures and was abandoned after the arrival of the Spanish Conquistadors. Although influenced by the Incas, they were never conquered by them.

Day 7, Revash (hiking from San Bartolo Village) (about 3 hour drive total)

Revash, near the village of San Bartolo, south of the city of Chachapoyas, is a late Chachapoya funerary complex with chullpas (mausoleums) built high into limestone cliffs, at an altitude of 2,800m above sea level. Constructed of rock and adobe, plastered and painted pink and cream, they look like little houses, but are in fact, tombs. Most were ransacked long ago; a few yielded some bones and funerary offerings for archaeologists to examine. From these bones, it was possible to deduce that Revash's mausoleums were not used individually: it is thought that they were collective residences, destined to bury the prestigious and power-







ful.

Accommodation: Kentitambo, Double & Triple Rooms

Day 8, Drive to Cajamarca (approx. 8 hour drive)

Today is a travel day with a long scenic drive to Cajamarca (around 8 hours). Although long, this drive is one of the most spectacular in Peru, taking you through the most diverse landscape and ecological zones across the Marañon River, one of the main tributaries of the Amazon River.

Arrive in Cajamarca in the late afternoon where you may like to stretch your legs on a walk around this small city with your guide .

Accommodation: Costa del Sol Cajamarca

Meals: Breakfast & Boxed Lunch

Day 9, Fly to Lima & Transfer to Paracas (3 hours)

Today you will be driven early in the morning to the airport to board your flight back to Lima.

On arrival in Lima, a representative and private transportation will take you to the south (3.5 hours drive) to Paracas.

This area is famous for the desert sand dunes and Ballestas Islands which teem with marine life. Check-in to your hotel for a 3-night stay. Afternoon at leisure to enjoy some pool time.

Accommodation: Hilton Double Tree

Meals: Breakfast & Boxed Lunch

Day 10, Ballestas Islands - Kayaking & Marine Safari

Rise early this morning so that you are out on the water to witness the sunrise. Paddle kayaks along the Pacific and look out for cormorants, pelicans and flamingos.

Meet your private motor-yacht at el Candelabro, an enormous and mysterious geoglyph carved into the desert rock. Afterwards continue to the Ballestas Is-



lands, home to diverse coastal fauna.

Have lunch on board as you cruise around several small islands while hearing cries from sea lions, spot Humboldt penguins and a wide variety of guano birds.

Notes: A private motor yacht is included for the Ballestas Islands visit in order to offer a better experience. The yacht has two cabins with bathrooms and so after the Kayak session you can change cloths and freshen up easily.

The minimum age to kayak is 7 years old. We use kayaks with capacity for 2 people so children can be accompanied by the guide or one adult.

Day 11, Desert Dune Driving

Morning at leisure.

This afternoon, enjoy the action and adventure of crossing this desert in SUVs driven by experts who know the spectacular Paracas dunes. End with a dinner under the stars in a unique location.

Accommodation: Hilton Double Tree

Meals: Breakfast & Dinner

Day 12, Fly to Cuzco & Transfer to the Sacred Valley

Spend this morning at your leisure before you afternoon flight to Cuzco from Pisco Airport.

On arrival, you will be welcomed and transferred by road to the peaceful region of the Sacred Valley. The drive time is around 90 minutes. The Sacred Valley is located 1,600 feet lower than Cuzco City, therefore allowing a gentle acclimatisation process to altitude.

The villa was built around 10 years ago by the owner Sonia Pinto. She has an exquisite taste for detail and art and the house is filled with unique pieces from her collection. Beyond this, the distribution of the house includes two terraces,





high ceilings and big windows in the different areas in order to make the most of the daylight and allow guests to see the natural beauty of the Sacred Valley.

The villa has two floors with 5 bedrooms and the house facilities include: 2 Living rooms (1st and 2nd floor), dining room, TV, 2 Terraces (1st & 2nd floor), a Jacuzzi located on the 1st floor with capacity of 8 people and earth oven.

The private concierge will live in the house so that there is someone with you in case of any eventuality (someone getting sick in the middle of the night, or so). This lady will run the house (service, meals, drinks, snacks, ...) so you are well cared for. The host has a background in hospitality including Food & Beverage and has worked in a number of hotels. She is a great host, speaks perfect English.

Day 13, Horseback Riding & Hiking in Maras & Moray

You will be picked up this morning and driven to the Andean community of Maras Village to meet the horses. En route you can observe Andean communities with their traditional adobe (mud brick) houses. Familiarise yourself with the horses and then begin the ride through a spectacular trail away from the touristy route. Arrive at the site of Moray which was used as an Incan laboratory to produce crops. Ancient people of the region took four enormous natural dips in the landscape and sculpted them into several levels of agricultural terraces that served as an agricultural station for the development of different crops.

Lunch today is a Pachamanca – a typical and ancient Peruvian cooking technique in an earth oven where native ingredients of potatoes, vegetables and meats are wrapped in local herbs and cooked using wood-heated stones.

After lunch, visit Maras town where you can see the salt works. These comprise about 3,000 small pools with an average area of 5m² each, constructed in a slope of the 'Qaqawiñay' mountain. Local people irrigate the pools during the dry season every three days using salty water emanating from a natural spring located on the top of the complex, so that when water evaporates, the salt contained in it will slowly solidify. That process will be carried out for approximately one month until a considerable volume of solid salt is obtained.

Day 14, Zip Line/Via Ferrata with lunch at the sky lodge

Your guide will take you to a short walk to the starting point of the Zip Line. Follow a succession of 6 cables, each one varying in length between 100 and 500 metres. This way you'll finish your day flying over the Sacred Valley. Lunch at the sky-lodges, a unique construction of glass pods hanging over the valley.

Note: The skypods are shared with other travellers.

Accommodation: Private Villa

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

Day 15, Ollantaytambo – Silique - Ancascocha Trek

We pick you up early from your villa and transfer you to Chillca where you meet the crew and begin a hike up towards the Silique Canyon. Begin to ascend by way of a narrow canyon following a stream that will gradually get smaller. Observe tall granite walls on the sides of the canyon populated by a large variety of orchids and bromeliads, filling the environment with magnificent colours when in bloom.

Continue by crossing the stream several times until you reach higher lands and find the camp set up near the village and lake of Ancashcocha.

Accommodation: Camping

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

Day 16, Ancascocha - Paucacancha

After a hearty breakfast prepare for a challenging day. Begin ascending towards the high Huayllanay Pass (4,550 metres). Take a steep zigzag trail up to where you'll find an original cobblestone paved Inca trail that will lead to the high pass. Spot the beautiful waterfall that feeds into the Ancashcocha glacier lake. The wild "Huallata" or Andean Geese and Black Ibis are often spotted in this high area.

Enjoy a picnic lunch in the midst of this high mountain scenery. Begin descending and pass by the ruins of Inca Rajay and the settlements that mark the way to the village of Q'esqa. Follow a long descending trail into greener vegetation while views of the classic Inca trail to Machu Picchu appear in the distance. Later in the afternoon, reach the campsite next to the beautiful Inca remains of Paucacancha: A unique Inca settlement restored to original condition that probably served as a "Tambo" or rest point and also a control point between two canyons





that lead the way to the main trail to Machu Picchu. Views of the nearby Glacier, snow peaks and well-preserved Inca remains are the highlight of this day

Accommodation: Camping

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

Day 17, Paucarcancha – Km. 82 – Ollantaytambo

After breakfast, descend on a well-defined trail down a narrow canyon to the Hatunchaca bridge near the village of Huayllabamba where you join the Classic Inca Trail and the numerous hikers who will be going in the opposite direction.

Continue to hike down a wide trail until you reach a lookout point to observe the Llastapata archaeological complex: this large Inca remain was restored a few years ago. Further along, continue descending until you reach the valley floor next to the Urubamba River. Hike upriver to Km. 82 where transport will be waiting in order to take you back to Ollantaytambo.

Accommodation: El Alberque de Ollantaytambo

Meals: Breakfast & Lunch

Day 18, KM 104 Hike to Machu Picchu

Today's hike is to arrive at the citadel of Machu Picchu taking the path of the Inca Trail from Km 104.

Early in the morning you'll depart from the villa to the Ollantaytambo train station where you board the Vistadome or Inca Rail train to KM104. This rail journey follows the Urubamba River through the Canyon of Vilcanota to the Lost City of the Incas. The train will stop at KM 104 to venture onto the Inca Trail with your guide. Cross the Vilcanota River and visit the Inca site of Chachabamba, and then follow the trail to an impressive archaeological site called Wiñay Wayna. Observing the masterful Inca engineering used to create these structures is a highlight of the trail. The site features a series of Inca baths that help pressurise water for agricultural irrigation and the city's food production. Before continuing towards Inti Punku, stop for lunch and soak up the first views of Machu Picchu. A quick descent along the wide royal Inca road takes you to Machu Picchu's gate. This afternoon enjoy wandering around Machu Picchu with your guide. Later you board the bus down to Aguas Calientes where your guide leads you to your hotel for a night's stay.





Accommodation: Machu Picchu Pueblo Hotel, Superior Double & Superior Triple Rooms (three beds)

Meals: Breakfast, Boxed Lunch & Dinner

Day 19, Day at leisure

After a busy few days of hiking, consider a second night at the Machu Picchu hotel with no planned activities.

Accommodation: Machu Picchu Pueblo Hotel

Meals: Breakfast & Dinner

Day 20, Visit Machu Picchu & Return to Cuzco

Enjoy a second visit to the citadel this morning and an early morning hike to Machu Picchu Mountain. (under new regulations the main entry is now divided between the morning and afternoon. Mornings are busier than afternoons in terms of visitor numbers.

Machu Picchu Mountain Hiking Notes:

Machu Picchu Mountain is another mountain hike for travellers looking for an additional challenge in the search for the best views of Machu Picchu. Towering at an altitude of 3,080 metres above sea level, this is a consistent uphill hike that departs from the gates of Machu Picchu (2,400 metres). Compared to Huayna Picchu the path up to the mountain is wider and well-preserved although it gradually turns narrower and steeper when it approaches the summit. There are several view points along the way, so even if you don't reach the summit you will be able to find beautiful sights to the surrounding mountains. This hike can take from 3 to 4 hours (round trip) and is rated moderate to challenging. We advise this hike for travellers who are in good physical condition.

Please note that there are schedule times for doing the hike to Machu Picchu Mountain which has been confirmed as follows:

- *Machu Picchu Mountain: 07:00-08:00*

At the agreed time later today, board the bus to Aguas Calientes and catch the **Sacred Valley train** departing at 19:30 to Ollantaytambo where private transport will take you back to Cuzco. Dinner included onboard the train.

Accommodation: Monasterio Hotel





Meals: Breakfast & Dinner on the train

Day 21, Cuzco Historic Centre & Chocolate Workshop

Spend today with your private guide exploring the nooks and crannies of Cuzco.

Start at San Pedro Market, where you can appreciate a full demonstration of colour and authenticity. Your guide will show you the different native Andean Peruvian products. From the market, your guide will take you to the key sights of the city. Visit the 16th Century Cathedral and the rich colonial treasures it houses. Also visit the Santo Domingo Convent, once the Sacred temple of the Sun, also known as the Qoricancha where the inner walls were, according to the chronicles, once completely covered in gold.

This afternoon head to the Chocolate Museum and participate in a hands-on workshop (shared with other travellers) making your own chocolate. Learn the entire process from the cacao seed all the way to the chocolate bar.

Day 22, Day at leisure

Spend today at leisure soaking up the charms of Cuzco.

Accommodation: Monasterio Hotel

Meals: Breakfast

Day 23, Cuzco – Puerto Maldonado – Refugio Amazonas

You will be transferred to the airport in Cuzco to board a flight to Puerto Maldonado, Peru's Amazon Gateway.

Your guide will welcome you at the airport. From there you are driven to the lodge's office to obtain the official waterway permits (you can also store the luggage you won't need during your stay in the jungle). You'll have a little time to see the town's main square and the beautiful scenery overlooking the confluence of the rivers Madre de Dios and Tambopata. From here it is a 45 minute transfer to the port where you board a boat for the 3 hour journey to the lodge.



Arriving at the lodge, you are provided a welcome orientation talk and safety briefing. Then after dinner there will be the opportunity to go out for a night exploration.

Note 1: fixed transportation times depart from Puerto Maldonado at 13:00 and 13:30.

Note 2: excursions at the Amazon lodges are on a small group basis.

Note 3: rooms are adjacent - take flip-flops and have them easily accessible for use in the rooms.

Day 24, Refugio Amazonas – Tambopata Research Centre

After an early breakfast, depart to Tambopata Research Centre (5hrs approx. by boat).

On arrival to the lodge you can choose from the activities on an a la carte basis offered by the lodge such as: Macaw Clay Lick – Colorado, Jaguar Search at Dawn, The World of Butterflies, Birding, Secrets of the Surroundings, Blue and Yellow Macaw, Ceiba Walk, Monkey Walk, Amazon Overlook Trail, Island Exploration & Pond, Toucan Trail, Macaw project nest visit, Enthusiastic Birding, Amazon Creek Trail, Bamboo Trail among others.

Note: rooms are in the same block.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

Day 25, Activities at the Research Centre

Choose from the activities on offer by the lodge – a la carte basis.

Accommodation: Tambopata Research Centre

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

Day 26, Return to Lima

After breakfast, transfer back to Puerto Maldonado by riverboat (around 5-6 hours) followed by a one hour drive, pick up your luggage, and then head on to the airport for your onward flight to Lima.







Note: fixed departure only at 5.00am.

On arrival in Lima a representative will assist you with your check in at the hotel located in the airport. Overnight in Lima (for logistical purposes).

Day 27, Onwards to Rio de Janeiro

Meet your airport rep who will assist with check in of your international flight to Rio.

On arrival in Rio, you will be welcomed by a laterallife representative and transferred to your hotel.

The Cariocas (locals from Rio) say that God spent 6 days creating the world and the 7th day creating Rio de Janeiro. With such a spectacular setting of Humpback Mountains overlooking the green azure waters of the ocean, the expansive Tijuca rainforest coupled with world famous Copacabana and Ipanema beaches and guarded by the Statue of Corcovado which hides magnificently among the clouds, who is to argue with this viewpoint!

Day 28, Sugarloaf Mountain and Lapa

Half day private tour visiting Sugarloaf Mountain and Lapa. From Copacabana, drive through Lapa, the famous Selaron stairs and a quick drive around the downtown area where many historical and cultural sites are located. Visit one of the most popular attractions in Rio - Sugar Loaf Mountain, whose name derives from the mountain's shape resembling the moulds that were used in the sixteenth century to produce sugar. Built in 1912 by a Brazilian engineer and renovated in 1973, the cable-car takes only 6 minutes. Once you are there the view from the top is simply superb.

Day 29, Rio de Janeiro

Enjoy a half day (5 hour) private tour in Rio. Rio is known for being a vibrant city as well as for its friendly warm and welcoming residents. Its colourful street fruit and vegetable markets display a lot of these qualities. They are all over Rio and are very easy to find being in different locations every day of the week. Starting the day by paying the market a visit is a great way to be introduced to a huge variety of exotic tropical fruits, sounds, tastes and colours. The vendors are very hospitable and are always pleased to give out some samples of their products. After a market visit, head to the statue of Christ the Redeemer, with its open arms blessing the whole city of Rio de Janeiro. It is exquisitely positioned on top of the 710m high Corcovado (hunchback) Hill. Made of concrete and soapstone, measuring 37m high and weighing 1,145 tonnes, the statue was inaugurated in 1931 and built with donations by the Catholic Church. A superb view of the whole city can be enjoyed from its open terraces, including the city centre and the beaches of the southern neighbourhoods such as Copacabana, Ipanema and the Lagoon.

Not far from Corcovado train station is a distinctive place that some call Rio's Montmartre. You cannot miss Santa Teresa, a unique part of Rio located on the hills with old houses and narrow streets. Here you can feel the atmosphere of art, music and history. Being home to several painters and artists, this little jewel is encircled by charming restaurants, bistros and bars that add a touch of both sophisticated and simple gastronomy.

Day 30, Departure

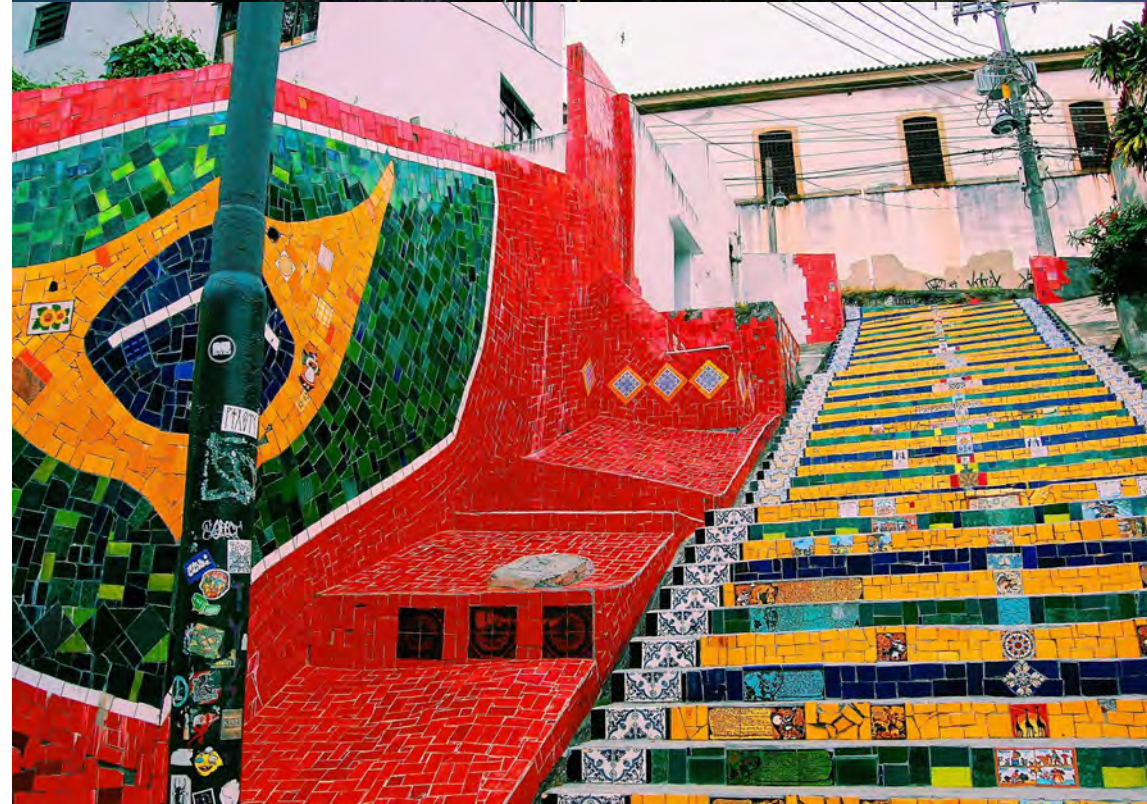

Private Villa, Ollantaytambo

The villa was built around 10 years ago by the owner Sonia Pinto. She has an exquisite taste for detail and art and the house is filled with unique pieces from her collection. Beyond this, the distribution of the house includes two terraces, high ceilings and big windows in the different areas in order to make the most of the daylight and allow guests to see the natural beauty of the Sacred Valley.

The villa has two floors with 5 bedrooms distributed as follow:

1st floor - 3 triple rooms each with private bathroom (shower)
- 1 twin room (optionally with king size bed) with private bathroom (shower)

2nd floor
- Master Suite (king size bed) with private bathroom (bathtub)

House facilities include: 2 Living rooms (1st and 2nd floor), dining room, TV, 2 Terraces (1st & 2nd floor), a Jacuzzi located on the 1st floor with capacity of 8 people and earth oven.

The private concierge will live in the house so that there is someone with you in case of any eventuality (someone getting sick in the middle of the night, or so). This lady will run the house (service, meals, drinks, snacks, ...) so you are well cared for. The host has a background in hospitality including Food & Beverage and has worked in a number of hotels. El Albergue de Ollantaytambo, Ollantaytambo

Originally opened in 1925 El Albergue is a historic hotel, located in the Ollantaytambo train station little more than an hour away from Machu Picchu and the city of Cusco. At El Albergue our gardens are visited by hummingbirds and engulfed by the aroma of fuchsia, passionflower, peaches and avocado trees. During your stay, you may spend days visiting the archaeological sites of Ollantaytambo, Pisaq and Moray; river rafting; biking; horseback riding and enjoying the beauty, cuisine and culture of the Andes - or simply relaxing in our hammocks and sauna.

Inkaterra Machu Picchu Pueblo

Tucked into lush gardens, the Pueblo Hotel has real flavour and is easily the best place to stay for naturalists who want to get a glimpse of some of the extraordinary bird- and plant life in this part of the Machu Picchu Historical Sanctuary. Tambopata Research Centre

The Tambopata Research Centre is the only lodge that lies within the 700,000 hectares of the Tambopata National Reserve, making it one of the most remote lodges in South America! The lodge's pristine location means that it's surrounded by the best wildlife the Amazon jungle has to offer. The comfortable 18 bedroom lodge was built more than twenty years ago (and rebuilt just a few years ago) with the object of lodging tourists and researchers alike and of protecting the adjacent macaw clay lick. The lodge rooms are unique due to the fact that one side of the room opens out onto the surrounding rainforest acting as a window into the forest allowing guests to enjoy this unique ecosystem even from the comfort of their hammocks. The lodge has a on site spa that offer s a variety of massages and treatments and a bar that serves up rainforest inspired cocktails and Peruvian classics.
