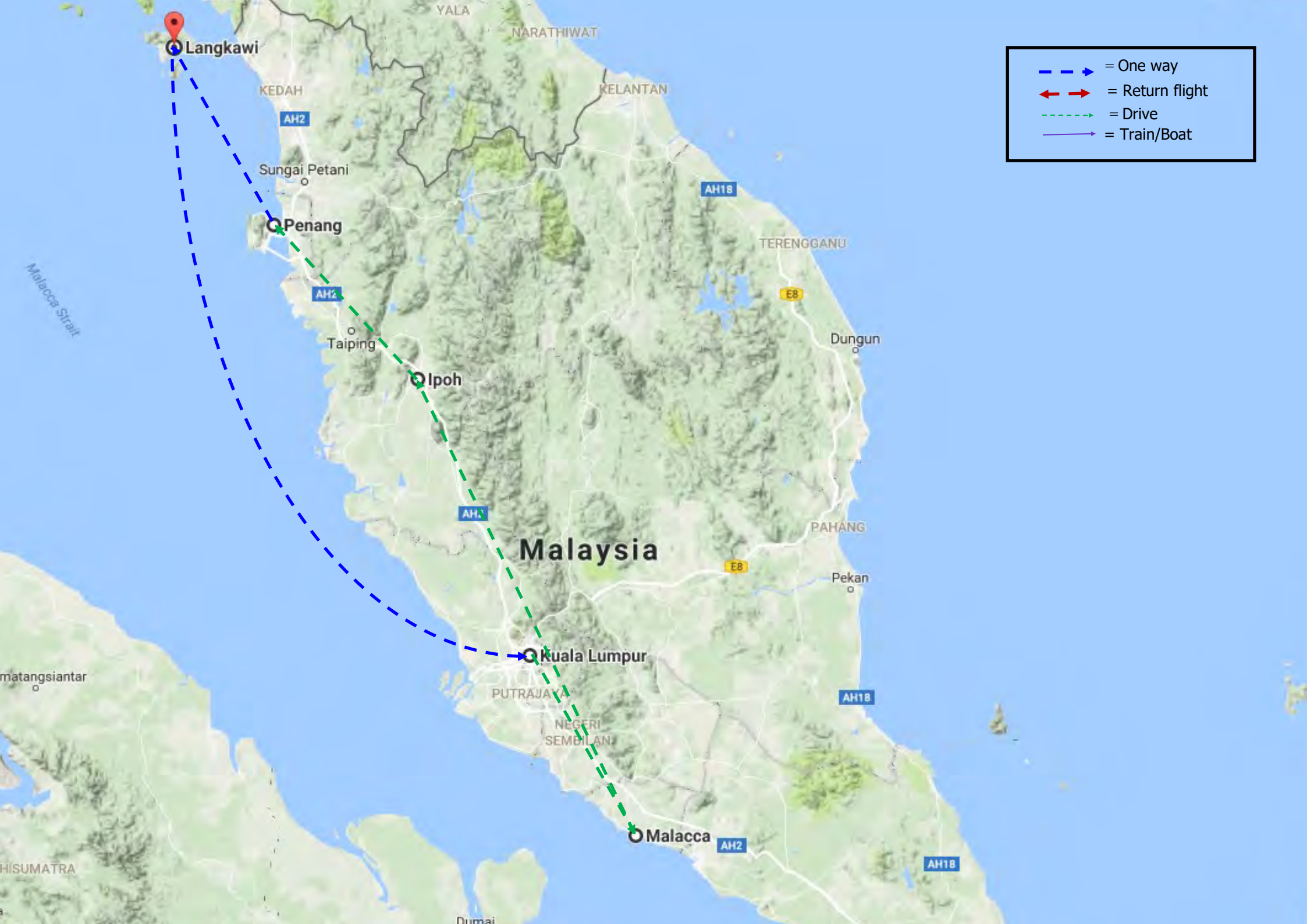

Your Sample Itinerary...

Day 1, - Depart UK for Kuala Lumpur.

Today make your way to the airport to catch your overnight flight to Kuala Lumpur.

Accommodation: Overnight flight.

Meals: Inflight meals.

Day 2, - Arrival in Kuala Lumpur - Malacca.

Welcome on arrival at Kuala Lumpur International Airport by a laterallife representative and transfer around 2 hours to Malacca for a 3-night stay. Check-in and enjoy the remainder of today at your leisure.

The historic city of Malacca is steeped in a rich tapestry of multicultural influences reflected in its heritage architecture, diverse lifestyles and eclectic cuisine. Founded centuries ago by a Sumatran prince, Malacca grew to become a powerful sultanate and the centre of the lucrative spice trade, visited by Arab, Tamil and Chinese merchants and subjected to dominance by the Portuguese, Dutch and British in turn. Each left their mark, creating the unique and enduring allure of the city today.

Accommodation: The Majestic Melaka, Deluxe Room.

Meals: None.

Day 3, - Malacca Walking tour with Serge.

After breakfast enjoy a historical heritage tour of Malacca, an adventure through more than 600 years of history to the present status of UNESCO World Heritage Site. Malacca is the only state and city in Malaysia to have been ruled by three different colonial powers - the Portuguese, Dutch and lastly the British.

Set off at around 10.00am and stretch your legs with a walking tour of Malacca with Serge, owner of the Snail House. Cross the bridge over the Malacca River, once the centre of trade between the East and West. Accompanied by Serge, walk along both sides of the river and learn about the Malay Sultans, the Portuguese, Dutch, British and Japanese, who one after another, ruled over the Straits of Malacca.

From churches to tombs, listen to the call of the muezzin over the tiled roofs of Malacca, where the Buddhists, Christians, Hindus, Muslims and Taoists, all pray in the same religious fervour.

This afternoon is at your leisure and we suggest a leisurely stroll along Malacca's antique row known as Jonker Street where you find a mishmash of antiques, art galleries, souvenirs, dried food and more.





This evening walk along the street-food market on Jonker Street and perhaps dinner at Nancy's Kitchen (reservations advised).

Accommodation: The Majestic Melaka, Deluxe Room.

Meals: Breakfast & Lunch.

Day 4, - Evening River Cruise.

Today is at your leisure to explore the city.

This evening enjoy a minute boat ride on the Malacca River, passing by small fishing villages and a number of historical buildings dotted along the river.

Optional activities:

Sunday Morning Antique Market - Every Sunday morning until 12pm you can enjoy the little antique market along Jalan Hang Lekir (right next to the popular Geographer Cafe).

Try Sate Celup for lunch - Sate Celup is a typical Malaccan way of eating sate skewers with all types of food, varying from meat, fish, seafood and vegetables. Restaurant Ban Lee Hiang along Jalan Ong Kim Wee is very popular among locals.

Day 5, - Transfer from Malacca to Ipoh.

After breakfast depart to the 'Town Built on Tin' also known as Ipoh.

Ipoh was home to wealthy miners during the tin mining heyday and driving through the town feels a little like being caught in a time warp. Ipoh town itself is sectioned into two parts. The Kinta River divides the historic centre of Ipoh into Old Town and New Town with the Old Town home to old Chinese and colonial styled buildings while the New Town of Ipoh is home to the livelier business hub.

You have the option to stretch your legs with a wander through the Old Town before arriving at the Banjaran. A stop is also made at the Sam Poh Tong Cave Temple in Gunung Rapat. The temple houses an impressive work of art with various statues of Buddha set among the natural stalactites and stalagmites.

Arrive later this afternoon at the Banjaran, one of Malaysia's lesser known retreats.

Accommodation: The Banjaran Hotsprings Retreat, Garden Villa.

Meals: Breakfast & Dinner. Dinner includes an appetizer, main course and dessert. It can be chosen from the a la carte menu.



Day 6-7, - At leisure.

These next two days are at your leisure. Enjoy the hot-springs and Spa at the Banjaran.

Optional activity:

Taiping & Maxwell Hill - Taiping (30 mins approx. drive time) dates back to the 1870s and during the 19th Century became famous for its tin mining activities. Taiping has some historical buildings, a famous zoo and the beautiful Taiping Lake Gardens. Stroll through the lake gardens before taking a 4x4 ride (mostly old Land Rovers) up Butik Larut (Maxwell Hill) for fantastic views of the lowlands below. This spot is a former British hill station to escape the heat.

Accommodation: The Banjaran Hotsprings Retreat, Garden Villa.

Meals: Breakfast & Dinner.

Day 8, - Ipoh - Kuala Kangsar - Taiping - Penang.

Check-out after breakfast and transfer to Kuala Kangsar, a most attractive royal town, around 60km north of Ipoh. Along the way you may choose to stop at the Ubudiah Mosque and the Iskandariah Palace (royal palace).

The Ubudiah Mosque is reputed to be one of the most beautiful mosques in the country. Its construction began in the reign of Sultan Idris Murshidul Adzam Shah 1, the 28th Sultan of Perak. Elephants damaged the Italian marble flooring twice during WW1.

Next stop will be at Taiping. The town of Taiping in Malaysia means "Eternal Peace" and is Perak State's foremost historic town. Formerly, known as Larut, the town was in the midst of a bloody feud between Chinese secret societies who worked the lucrative tin mines in the 1870s. After peace was declared between the feuding parties in 1874, the town changed to its present name. Before the founding of Kuala Lumpur in the south, Taiping prospered for several decades, scoring a number of firsts: first museum in the country, first English newspaper; first swimming pool. Today, it is chock-a-block with heritage buildings.

From Taiping continue the transfer to Penang crossing over the 4th longest bridge in South East Asia. Upon arrival, check-in to the historic Eastern & Oriental Hotel for a 2-night stay.

Accommodation: Eastern & Oriental Hotel, Deluxe Suite.

Meals: Breakfast.

Day 9, - Eating Asia - Heritage Walk Tour.

We suggest a light breakfast this morning.

Head out with your guide today on an 'Eating Asia Heritage Walk' through UNESCO World Heritage Georgetown.





Experience the historical and vibrant atmosphere of the city and starting in Chowrasta Market to witness the lively roadside trading of livestock, fruit and vegetables. This is followed sampling bread which has been toasted over charcoal.

Stop by Campbell Street, which was formerly named "Sin Kay" by the Chinese in the 19th century, and is one of Penang's notable precincts where vendors sell a bit of everything in small Chinese shop-houses. Treat yourself to "yu char kuih" (Donut fritters) at Campbell Street Wet Market, probably the oldest existing market in Georgetown dating back to the early 1900s. Try dim sum such as succulent steamed pork spareribs and "char siu bao" (steamed buns with roast pork) to mouth-watering shrimp dumplings which are known locally as "har gao".

Visit Khoo Kongsi where the Clan House building features a magnificent hall embellished with intricate carvings and woodwork. Pass the Kapitan Kling Mosque which has a dome-shaped minaret and is named after an Indian Muslim merchant, then sample an Indian Muslim traditional pancake known as roti canai for brunch.

Wander to Sri Maha Mariamman Temple, a Dravidian-style temple, which sports a sculptured tower or Gopuram, covered in brightly painted statues of gods and goddesses. Your walking tour continues with a visit the Goddess of Mercy Temple, a temple honouring Kuan Yin built in the 1800s by early Chinese settlers of the Hokkien and Cantonese communities. The temple was originally named Kong Hock Keong temple (Cantonese-Hokkien Temple).

For lunch, enjoy banana leaf rice at nearby Banana Leaf Restaurant and quench your thirst with a glass of 'pulled' tea (teh tarik).

The remainder of today is at your leisure.

Accommodation: Eastern & Oriental Hotel, Deluxe Suite.

Meals: Breakfast & Lunch.

Day 10, - Island Tour.

Set off on a half day exploration of Penang. Discover the enchanting beauty of Penang and her secrets with this essential circular island tour that takes you through idyllic and picturesque fishing villages. Stop at the Penang Batik Handicraft centre to observe how Malaysian Batik is being made. Stop at a street stall to be introduced to the many varieties of fruits and spices produced from the local farmers. Drive to the valley where clusters of traditional Malay villages and paddy fields can be seen. Proceed to the famous Snake Temple where pit vipers coil unperturbed on altars and temple grounds.

Optional activity:

A visit to Penang isn't complete without a visit to the beautifully preserved and restored Cheong Fatt Tze Mansion which also now serves as a small hotel – see

Day 11, - Fly from Penang to Langkawi.

Check out of your hotel and transfer to the airport in Penang for a flight to Langkawi.

Upon arrival in Langkawi, your driver will transfer you to your hotel. Check-in for a 6-night stay in Langkawi.

One of only four inhabited islands in an archipelago of 99 islands in the Andaman Sea, Langkawi is a nature-lover's dream – relished for its equatorial climate, tropical flora and fauna, and clear emerald waters. Two-thirds of the island's dramatic mountainous landscape is covered with rainforest, while vibrant coral reefs lie just off shore.

Once a haven for pirates, Langkawi's intriguing cultural and ethnic diversity can be traced back to its days as a centre for Chinese, Indian and Arab traders. In a spectacular setting on Langkawi's northern cape, Langkawi offers easy access to discoveries on land and at sea, from bird watching, snorkelling and diving to jungle trekking, golf and island-hopping tours.

Accommodation: The Datai, Canopy Premium Room.

Meals: Breakfast & Dinner.

Day 12, - Afternoon Mount Mat Chinchang.

This morning is at your leisure.

This afternoon you'll be transferred to the Langkawi Cable Car located in the Oriental Village. The clear bubble shaped cable car takes the 2.2km ride up the mountainside on a 42-degree incline from where you can see the Seven Wells (Telaga Tujuh) Waterfalls and also the dense tropical forest which is part of the UNESCO World Heritage Geopark. At the highest station, enjoy a drink in the café as the sun goes down, cross the Sky-Bridge (which ranks among the world's longest curved suspension bridges at 125 metres in length) and send a post card using the specially placed post box!

After the mountain visit, pass by Black Sand Beach before returning to your hotel.

Note: Cable car operates subject to weather conditions.

Day 13-16, - At Leisure.

Day 17, - Fly from Langkawi to Kuala Lumpur & Selangor Pewter.

After breakfast at your hotel and check out and transfer to the airport in Langkawi for a flight to KL.

Upon arrival, prior to checking into your hotel, visit the Royal Selangor Pewter Centre. Founded in 1885, Royal Selangor is the world's foremost name in quality pewter, a brand synonymous with design and craftsmanship. In the hands of our skilled craftspeople, this versatile alloy of tin, copper and antimony is transformed into an endless variety of home-ware and gifts sold in more than twenty countries around the world. The Visitor Centre takes you back over a hundred years to the founding of Royal Selangor and its inextricable link with the history of Malaysia, to the present day as the world's largest pewter maker and its expansion into gold and sterling silver. During your visit you can try your hand at making your own creation of pewter.

Later you are transferred to your hotel for a 2-night stay.

The appeal of this nation's capital city cannot be denied. Be immediately struck by South-east Asia's tallest building stamping its mark on the iconic Kuala Lumpur city skyline. A mesmerising blend of old and new, the city's dynamism is reflected within its offerings; stroll through cultural enclaves, take in historical sites and landmarks that dot the city centre and enjoy yourself amongst modern day attractions.

Accommodation: The Majestic Kuala Lumpur, Deluxe Room.

Meals: Breakfast.

Day 18, - Forgotten Trails of Kuala Lumpur.

Think of Kuala Lumpur and what comes to the mind is the Twin Towers, modern high-rise skyscrapers and the busy, modern streets of Kuala Lumpur. Go behind the modern high-rise skyscrapers and visit the forgotten trails of KL.

Starting from a typical Malay village "Kampung Baru", stroll through streets where Malaysian style food stalls sprout like mushrooms. Marvel at the contrasting picture of traditional small Malay houses fronting this busy street, against the backdrop of the famous KL skyscrapers. Stop at one of the food stalls and try some local Malay sweets or cakes. Venture through the wet Chow Kit market, where housewives and hawkers haggle over prices. Chinese, Malays and Indian traders set up their poultry, beef, flowers, seafood and fruit stalls, all vying for a part of the action.

Walk through Little India, past the jewellery and saree shops and the beautiful Masjid

Jamek mosque. Then onto China Town, ending at the National Museum.

Finish your tour with a visit to a traditional Chinese Tea House in China Town. After which your guide will bring you to the Old China Café for lunch (paid locally) before returning to your hotel.

This afternoon, take the lift to the top of the famous Petronas Towers and a stop at the railway station to see its East meets West architecture. Finish at Central Market where you can browse the countless stores. You may like to head to the famous shopping district at Suria KLCC Mall.

Optional evening activity (not included):

Enjoy sunset drinks at the Sky Lounge in the Maya Hotel with its stunning view of the Petronas Towers.

Accommodation: The Majestic Kuala Lumpur, Deluxe Room.

Meals: Breakfast.

Day 19, - Departure home.

At the agreed time, transfer to the international airport for your departure flight to the UK.

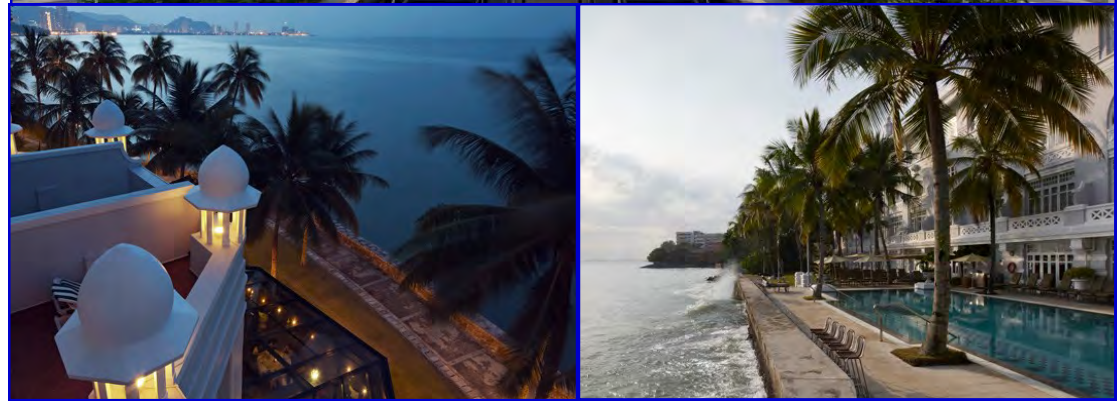
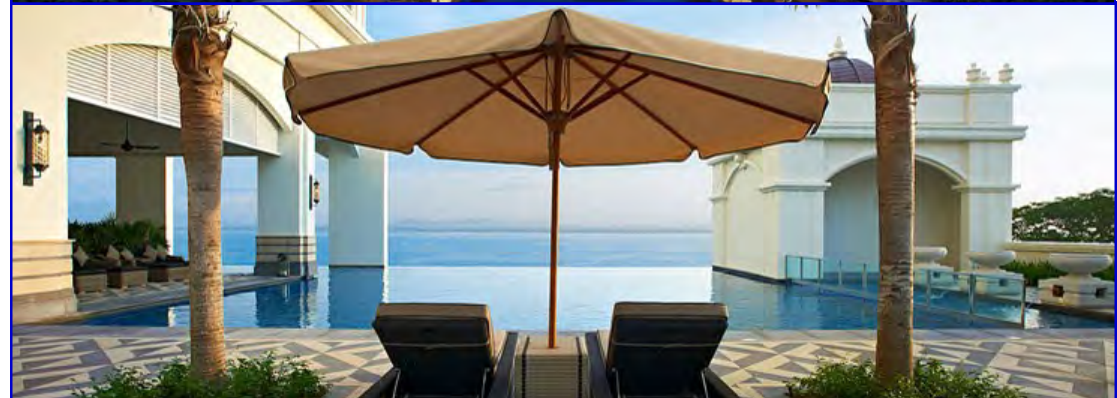

The Majestic, Kuala Lumpur
